(SYLLABUS FOR THE POST OF CIVIL JUDGE JUNIOR DIVISION EXAMINATION)

- Eligibility criteria - LL.B.
- Age Limit - Not more than 35 years
- (For SC/ST/BC/EWS - 5 years relaxation)
- (For PwD - 10 years relaxation) (Locomotor disability)
- (a) Direct Recruitment: Applicants applying under direct recruitment must possess a Bachelor's Degree in Law awarded by any University established by Law in India.
- (b) Recruitment by Transfer: A person applying under Recruitment by Transfer must possess a Degree in Law awarded by any University established by Law in India and must be a confirmed member or approved probationer in any one of the categories.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

Preliminary Examination (Screening Test) will be Computer Based Test for 100 marks comprising of 100 multiple choice objective type Questions. The duration of examination will be two (2) hours.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION

Each paper shall carry 100 marks. The duration of each paper is three (3) hours.

- (iii) English Translation & Essay Writing

Note: For selection to the posts of Civil Judge, the candidate belonging to OC/EWS, BC, and SC/ST who secure at least 55, 50, 45 percent respectively of the marks in each paper and 60, 55, 50 percent in aggregate and viva-voice shall alone be eligible for selection to the post.

INTERVIEW

In the interview, the academic knowledge of a candidate, his communication skills, his tact, and ability to handle various situations in the Court, will be tested.
