- V. The principles of Equity with special references to the Law of Trust and Specific Relief

- VII. Constitutional Law

Note: There shall be questions of 50 marks in relation to Constitutional Law alone.

Paper IV- Law II (Procedure and Evidence):

(200 Marks)

Questions set will be restricted to the field covered by:

Paper V - Law III (Penal, Revenue and Local Law):

(200 Marks)

The questions set will be restricted to the field covered by

- I. Indian Penal Code
- II. The Uttar Pradesh Revenue Code, 2006
- III. Uttar Pradesh Urban Buildings (Regulation of Letting, Rent and Eviction) Act, 1972
- IV. Uttar Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1916
- V. Uttar Pradesh Panchayati Raj Act, 1947
- VI. Uttar Pradesh Consolidation of Holdings Act, 1953
- VII. Uttar Pradesh Urban (Planning and Development) Act 1973, together with rules framed under the aforesaid Acts
- VIII. Uttar Pradesh Regulation of Urban Premises Tenency Act, 2021

Note: Answer to the questions of Local Laws will be compulsory. Questions pertaining to Penal Laws will be of 50 Marks, Whereas, that of Revenue and Local Laws will be of 150 Marks.
